Meeting opens at 7.40pm, Coton Liberal Club, 13<sup>th</sup> January, 2016

**Minutes of last meeting:** Passed as true record

**Treasurer's report:** G/A £8212.67. C/F £6897.87. Raffle receipts £537. Ticket printing £33.95 = £503.50 profit. 200 Club Nov/Dec £490. Last Man Standing £500. Accounts for year 31/12/2015 completed in draft for submission to accountant.

**Membership:** Ongoing. More new members recently.

**Christmas Raffle:** Despite a drop in ticket sales, due to lost of youth team, a profit of £503.50 was forthcoming. Dave Hall proposed that this year we should look to getting tickets in September, for selling a month earlier. More voucher prizes could be sorted this year.

**Disabled Shelter:** The committee was shown the latest plans printed out to A1 size. We should push on now and obtain costs for shelter. Ready for presentation.

**Diary of Events for 2016:** A whole series of suggestions have been made. Mike Turner will prepare a list of events and possible dates, for the year.

**Middlesbrough Re-United:** A vote of thanks was proposed by Dave Hall, seconded Roger Barnes to Mike Turner for his work on arranging the evening, which was a huge success. Dave Sharpe's presentation was superb. A DVD will be produced of the evening. 112 tickets were sold for the event plus 25 guests.

**A.O.B.:** 200 Club December draw 27<sup>th</sup> January at next meeting due to no home games. More people have joined recently plus extra forms have been sent out.

Due to a connection by a member of the Co-op board, the football club will be training by the end of the month at Bramcote Barracks, using their superb facilities. There would a strong community link to this arrangement.

A MOD security certificate will be need, costing £180. The Co-operative have been approached about paying for this certificate. This was discussed, and agreed that we could pay for it, an invoice should be produced. It was also pointed out that this was a one off decision, and should not be considered as setting a precedent.

There should be a strong publicity link from the Football Club to the Co-operative for this arrangement.
