Minutes of last meeting: Passed as true record

Treasurer's report: Report presented. Santander account now merged with Co-op Bank account leaving nil balance at Santander. General Account £6707.89 and Contingency Fund £6434.94. Small amount to remain in 200 account. Easyfundraising credited £54.66 to our account in next 7 days. £141 raised from quiz night.

Membership: Some chasing up of members that have not renewed so far. All members who have joined recently have received card and badge. Our membership still needs to be pushed further.

Disabled facility: Sub-committee met last night to review plans. Drawings have been received and were presented to the meeting. Roger explained that a project manager would be needed if the project goes ahead. Some possible sponsorship with local firms was suggested. A further meeting next week with L. Randle would be arranged. Roger has asked Council about planning permission. This would be required.

Remembrance: 11am on Wednesday, 11th November. Wreath purchased. Roger will do the speech, and read out the names of people interred. Seven at present. Coffee/tea and biscuits in the SFB Lounge afterwards.

Some discussion took place on the club's attitude to remembering fans who have died, and perhaps one game a season could be arranged to remember fans who have died during the past year.

Middlesbrough Reunited: Sub-committee meeting on Monday. Any videos and photos required. Light-year Films will do any editing.

FTTT: Work continues. Walk map ready and being reviewed by P. Lee. Art group's work continues on banner etc. A 1950's replica shirt was shown to the committee which will be produced to commemorate the FTTT project, and it's proposed to present this shirt to Hughie Morrow, a Boro star of the 1950's. If there is a demand, shirts could be manufactured and sold to fans. Roger Barnes again mentioned, it would be great to have a club museum/room to house the artifacts.

A.O.B.: Date booked with R. Hill for quiz next year. J. Skuce suggested running a Race Night again next year for charity.

P. Burdett asked if the k.o. on Saturday was 2pm again, due to the floodlights situation. This led to a vigorous discussion as to whether the Co-operative should be helping the football club financially e.g. paying for floodlight repairs. It was pointed out that our constitution would not allow it. Some members of the committee challenged this. It was pointed out that this was rejected by the last meeting, and could not be reversed.
