Minutes of last meeting: Passed as true record

Treasurer's report: G/A: £7,968.91. C/F: £6,897.87. No money in or out. Books at Accountants, due back April.

Members' concerns: About possible take over of football club, by ex-Leicester City chairman and consortium, and other rumours, Chinese consortium etc. Our chairman has been in touch with SD to asked about the ACV on the ground, awaiting reply. The football club have not been forthcoming on the rumours, but the Co-op should be ready if need be.

Supporters' Director: Still no further football club board meetings to report.

POY event: This has been left with the football club to suggest a date, the only one being 30th April, a match day. It was pointed out that it would not be possible to stage the event on this day due to the time needed to set the room up. It was suggested that we should give the club a deadline to come up with a date. It was suggested that it would have to be a shortened event in this case. It was pointed out that a shortage of interaction between supporters and players this season would be a problem.

200 Club draw: Before Saturday's game, in the bar.

FTTT end of funding event: Mike spoke of ex-players that would or would not be attending. This would need to be firmed up for interviews on the night etc. The mayor and MP would attend the day event. The meeting was shown the three latest banners that have been produced for FTTT. The Nuneaton Memories evening, a fortnight ago, had been a success for the FTTT project, with lots of interest. Others will follow. More material is still being donated to the project.

A scanner has been bought, enabling scanning at various places.

The Co-operative agreed to continue supporting the FTTT project after funding stops in April.

Programme of Events: For the year, was discussed. Contact had been made with Dave Cook regarding a Race Night. The date suggested was dependent on his football club's POY event.

No further movement on the disabled facility due to the football club's lack of interest.

There will be a permanent display of the FTTT project at the Heritage Centre. A day was spent last week, cleaning up trophies that had been rescued from the football club, including an Alliance runners-up trophy, and one presented by the Mayor commemorating the FA Cup run.
