The following summary of initiatives and events relating to the previous 12 months.

- Sponsored Kelvin Langmead and Brady Hickey.
- Continued to administer 200 Club, raising £2070 for club and similar amount for Supporters' Co-operative.
- Co-operative Board members continue to sell 50/50 and Golden Goal tickets for Club.
- Set up Boro heritage display in Rope Walk. Engaged with fans and townsfolk and completed questionnaires providing resultant feedback to the club and supporters.
- Above survey provided club with invaluable evidence to support application to FA in quest to 'bring back the Boro'.
- Continued to hold meetings with Rugby Club to find resolution to issues and build up working relationship.
- Ran further fund raisers, including quiz night, Christmas Raffle and Easyfundraising.
- Improved communication to members/supporters via website, Facebook, Twitter and also issued two newsletters.
- Maintenance work undertaken to Memorial garden.
- Organised Remembrance Day service and laid wreath in Memorial Garden.
- Submitted regular Co-operative notes for match day programme.
- Renewed affiliate membership of Football Supporters' Federation.
- Purchased 2 x second hand turnstiles for club. Also undertook painting of said items.
- Continued to provide financial support to the 'From Town to Town' heritage project.
- Purchased 42 DVDs recording Boro matches from 2012-14 seasons. These will eventually be downloaded via FTTT Youtube account.
